

From the Principal . . .

This year the second week of the school holidays coincides with Holy Week. As we prepare to once again make this journey with Jesus you might like to think about the following reflection:

"The events of Holy Week touch the full range of human emotions. At different times in our lives, we will relate to different figures in the stories. Sometimes, we will identify with the compromises Pilate makes for his career and other times we will identify with the manner in which Peter denies his friend because he is afraid. But other times, we will relate to Simon the Cyrene who was roped in to help, or the women who remained loyal when the men ran away, or the centurion who was confused by what he saw and wondered if 'this was a son of God', or the thief who asked to be remembered and received reassurance or Joseph of Arimathea who wanted to do the right thing but kept his faith a secret, again out of fear.

Holy Week is not just about remembering the past. The journey of Holy Week is about finding our own place near the cross of Jesus. Every year, as we read the stories of the death of Jesus once again, we find ourselves drawn into them in a different way. We learn more about ourselves and our need for Jesus."

Little things mean a lot!

"Family life is like a broad peaceful river, in which children are like sponges soaking up the water in which they are immersed. **Everything in life educates.**

At home, it is in the thousand apparently insignificant happenings of everyday life that young people learn how to judge things, how to behave and what to expect from life. They often pick up some of the strongest messages about our values and way of acting when we least expect it."

Thank you to all our families for all you do as the first and most important educators in the lives of our students.

First day: Term 2

Students return to school for the beginning of Term 2 on **Tuesday 22nd April.** This will be **Day 7** of our timetable. There are no changes to the College timetable for Term 2.

I ask that students make a note of this in their diaries and ensure they bring the appropriate materials for this day. There should be no excuses about incorrect books or uniform for the day.

Uniform

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Every student ordering photos must return an order envelope \underline{ON} photo day and give to AdvanceLife photographer.

Every student ordering photos must return *their own* order envelope – even if their payment is in their sibling's envelope.

Orders placed after photo day will be charged a late order fee.

Order Instructions

Select a photo package option - each option is explained on the flyer attached to the order envelope.

Complete your order envelope - use a black or blue ball point pen and fill in your order and contact details.

Complete payment - using one of the following options.

- From the team at AdvancedLife Photography.

CASH

Put exact money in order envelope.

No change will be given.

You can pay for all siblings in one order envelope - you must write on each order envelope the name and class of the sibling that has payment.

CHEQUE

Write your name, address and telephone number on the back of the cheque.

Dishonour fees will be charged if payment is declined.

YEAR 10 EXCURSION

The Old Melbourne Gaol

On the 6th of March, all the year 10 classes were given the opportunity to go and visit the Old Melbourne Gaol in the city as a part of their Humanities studies. Although a few students had missed out because of another class excursion, the day was still fun and a lot of knowledge was gained.

Upon arriving at the Old Melbourne Gaol, a helpful tour guide who had a profound knowledge of the building and its history assisted the classes and gave them a deeper insight on what it was like to be a prisoner at the Gaol. In particular, we learnt about the story of Ned Kelly; a very famous Australian Criminal and what he was charged with. Wandering around the gaol, was a good opportunity for the students to go inside the cells and take photos of significant monuments and equipment that had been used at the Gaol.

After having visited the Old Melbourne Gaol, it was time for lunch; which we had spent at the spacious yard of the Gaol, where we could run around and eat, a few students had also gone and bought items from the gift shop. We then visited our next location, a small building right next to the Gaol, which is known as the Watch house. Students were given a very detailed idea of what life was like to be a criminal, as the police officer with us treated us all like delinquents. This was a very good experience because it was helping us gain more knowledge of the prison cells first hand.

After this, we all then made our way to a courtroom where we role played a court scene based on the story of a case involving a culpable driving accident. This was a very interesting experience for us all and at the end we learnt a lot about how a court room works and the consequences of careless driving.
