It was this hope that enabled her to move to a small town and start a school for those whose educational opportunities were limited. Such schools, scattered far and wide, became a familiar part of the work of her Sisters of St Joseph and an icon of the church in Australia. Her life and work helped to transplant the message of Jesus to a new country and make it feel at home here. She trusted God even when there was plenty to worry about. She never gave up."

## Year 8 City Experience

From all accounts Year 8 students and staff had a terrific time on their recent Gr8 Escape into the City. Students spent the first day filming their promotional videos of Melbourne. This task is part of an English unit on advertising.

On the second day they compete in a "Melbourne Discovery Race", which is a large scale scavenger hunt around the city. Working in groups of 5 – 6, students use their initiative and wit to follow a Habits of Mind trail across the city. On the way they collect photos, treasures and information about the sites they visit. Points are awarded for each discovery.

Both students and staff arrived back exhausted but very happy. In their words, they walked 'miles' and had a great time. Staff were very impressed with students' kindness, impeccable manners and the way they cared for each other whilst they were out and about.

### ACARA Student Data Collection

This is in relation to the transfer of student background data from the CECV to ACARA for the purpose of calculating the Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage which is used for reporting school performance on the *My School* website.

Families who do wish the data of their child included in the transfer need to notify the College in writing by Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> August 2014.

# Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability

Our school has been selected to participate in the 2014 Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (Data Collection). This national Data Collection is taking place in schools across Australia and will provide information about the number of students with disability in schools, where they are located and the adjustments they receive.

The information provided by this new data collection will enable all Australian governments to better target support and resources. This will assist students with disability in government and non-government schools across Australia to complete school and go on to further education or find employment.

Inclusion in the Data Collection is voluntary. If you wish your child to be excluded from this, you can choose to opt-out of the data collection by informing us in writing.




# Family Matters

#### PRIVACY NOTICE

Information required to determine the *Index of Community Socio-educational Advantage* (ICSEA) for schools

This notice is from the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA), to advise you that ACARA has requested your child's school to provide ACARA with information about you and your child. Your school may disclose to ACARA information such as your child's gender, date of birth, country of birth, background language, residential address, parental occupation and parental education.

This information is disclosed to ACARA under the *ACARA Act 2008* for one or both of the following purposes:

- formulating national reports consisting of aggregated data on school performance;
   and
  - assisting government to formulate policies in relation to education matters.

ACARA will not disclose this personal information to any third party. If you do not want your school to provide this information to ACARA, please advise your school within seven (7) days of receiving this notice.
