# From the Principal...

## Advent: A time of Waiting, Anticipation and Preparation

Sunday marks the beginning of Advent; the beginning of a new Church year and a time of anticipation and preparation.

Advent is sometimes described as a season of waiting. In modern life we are used to waiting. We wait at the doctor's. We wait in traffic. We wait in line to be served at the local coffee shop. Advent is waiting, also, but not in the listless, zoned-out way like we might wait at the local coffee shop, nor in the anxious, bored way we might wait at the doctor's office or in traffic. Advent is an active waiting, a time of anticipation, a time when the Church prepares physically and spiritually—for the coming of the Christ child.

This feeling of anticipation is one we know well at this time of the year. With the countdown to the end of the school year, to holidays and to Christmas well under way, we live in constant anticipation of what is happening next. However, it is important that in the busyness of this time we don't

lose sight of the real point of the season; the birth of Christ. As a community of believers it is important to prepare personally and as a parish community for the coming of the Christ child. I pray that in the next few weeks, you will be blessed with the space to watch, wait and prepare for the birthday of Christ.

## Nothing is Impossible: Shared Stories 2014

The 2014 edition of *Shared Stories* was launched this week. This is an annual anthology of writing and art work by students in 18 Catholic primary and secondary schools. The anthology forms part of the permanent collection of the State Library of Victoria.

For writers and artists there is no greater honour than to have your work published. Once again a large number of students from our school have had their work accepted for publication. Congratulations to all the students who have had work included. This is an outstanding achievement. Well done.

Shared Stories was first published in 2006 with funding from the Felton Bequest. The concept was developed in response to the Cronulla riots in Sydney, as an authentic way of sharing perspectives across diverse groups.

From 72 pages it has expanded to 512 pages this year. This year's theme "Nothing is Impossible" invited students from diverse backgrounds to explore their hopes and dreams for the future.


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#### Wednesday Morning Mass Roster


