CONNECTION - RENEWAL: SHARED STORIES ANTHOLOGY 2016

The 2016 edition of *Shared Stories* was launched last week. This is an annual anthology of writing and art work by students in 22 Catholic primary and secondary schools. The anthology forms part of the permanent collection of the State Library of Victoria.

For writers and artists there is no greater honour than to have your work published. Once again a large number of students from our school have had their work accepted for publication. Congratulations to all who have had work included. This is an outstanding achievement. Well done.

This is the 11th edition of *Shared Stories*. The anthology was first published in 2006 with funding from the Felton Bequest. The concept was developed in response to the Cronulla riots in Sydney, as an authentic way of sharing perspectives across diverse groups.

From 72 pages it has expanded to a massive tomb of 573 pages. It is now almost too heavy for bedtime reading! It is an exceptional collection of writing and art work. Thank you to Ms Daniela Ibrido, the English and Visual Arts teachers for supporting student involvement in this activity, and to Ms Flora Petruccelli for accompanying students to the launch.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.


We request families on Direct Debit & Credit Card payments to contact the office on 9366 2544 to set up their Direct Debit & Credit Card payments for the 2017 School Year.


